



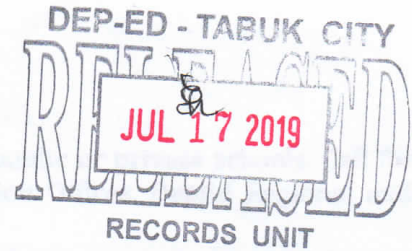

1. Population –Commission, Cordillera Administrative Region will conduct the Regional Adolescent Health and Development (AHD) Film Festival this year. One of the highlights will be Scriptwriting and Documentary Film Competition with the theme: ***"The youth and the Demographic Transition."***
2. This competition aims to develop and produce advocacy materials that highlight population related issues focusing on our youth.

**GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE 4TH REGIONAL
ADOLESCENT HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT (AHD) FILM FESTIVAL**

A. Theme: The Youth and the Demographic Transition

B. Guidelines:

B.1. Scriptwriting Competition

- The competition is open to **Grades 9, 10, and 11 students** from public or private schools. Call for entries will be disseminated through Provincial and City Population Offices, DepEd Regional and Division Offices, and POPCOM Website and social media platforms.
- **Only one entry per school** is allowed. (Only one team is allowed to represent the participating school.)
- Concept papers should be **original and have never been submitted in any previous competitions**. Failure to fully accomplish the submission form will result to disqualification.
- Deadline of submission of entries is on **August 2, 2019 at 5:00 PM**. Late submissions will not be accepted.
- Qualified teams shall **attend the Orientation on the Adolescent Health and Development Component, Demographic Dividend, and Filmmaking Workshop**. Those who cannot attend the workshops will not be allowed to proceed in the competition. A scriptwriter, director, and coach of the five (5) highest-rated concepts shall attend the said training.

B.2. Production and Technical Aspects

- Only **Grades 9, 10, and 11 students must be hands-on** in the whole production process including the shooting, writing, and editing stages.
- **Permits and relevant requirements must be secured** during the pre-production and production stages.
- The number of production team members for every school is **not restricted to any number**.
- **Rental of equipment is allowed**. Professional assistance during the production phase may be sought. However, students must be hands-on during the post-production stage, with minimal technical assistance.
- **Original and royalty-free music should be used**. Composition of original music is highly encouraged.
- **The use of local languages is encouraged**. All films must have English subtitles.
- The Regional Population Office may **conduct monitoring to provide technical assistance** as needed.

B.3. Submission of Entries

- Documentary films must have a **maximum running time of 15 minutes but not less than 10 minutes including credits and disclaimer**.
- AHD Film Festival entries must be submitted in complete Film Packages. Electronic copies should be included in a DVD-R package in a black standard DVD case. All documents must be in A4 size, Cambria, font size 12. The DVD-R package must contain the following files:
 - File format of film: **.avi** (should play in Windows Media, VLC Players)
 - 1-minute trailer
 - One (1) 150-word synopsis in English, one (1) 150-word synopsis in Filipino, both in Word format
 - **Soft copy of film poster, .png, 5ft x 3 ft, portrait**
 - **Soft copy of duly accomplished submission form including the following:**
 - Full list of crew (including coach)
 - Short biography of crew
 - Short biography, filmography of director
 - Individual high quality 2x2 photos of all the crew properly labelled with role and name. (i.e. Director_Edelene Fernandez).
 - **Soft copies of at least five (5) still photographs from the film**
 - **Soft copies of at least five (5) behind-the-scene photographs**
 - **Soft copy of script**



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- Scanned copies of crew members' consent letters with parents' signatures
- The complete Film Package must also include hard copies of the following:
- Photocopies of crew members' birth certificates
 - Original copies of crew members' consent letters with parents' signatures
- Failure to complete the documents aforementioned will lead to disqualification.**

D. Awards and Criteria for Judging

D.1. Scriptwriting Competition

- The documentary film concept papers will be evaluated according to its relevance to the theme, especially on how it effectively conveys the concepts on demographic transition. The documentary film's potential to be used as an advocacy material to promote the Philippine Population Management Program is shall be considered.
